In this “hands-on” course you will learn how to design web pages using HTML (Hypertext Markup Language). No special tools are needed – just a text editor (notepad++) and a browser. Students are expected to have a basic understanding of Windows and know how to use a browser.

The class will meet once a week for four weeks in a computer lab. Each class lasts three hours. The will be lecture, demonstrations, and hands-on exercises. Feel free to ask questions!
